#### Johanna Bommer

Johanna Bommer stages people in a commercial setting resembling a beauty campaign – grey backdrop, studio lighting and close-up shots.

The majority of her creative work takes place after the shoot, during retouching. In contrast to commercial photography, she is not interested in smoothness and perfection, but rather in the peculiarities of the people portrayed, such as skin redness or wrinkles.

### **Marco Frauchiger**

For his portrait photographs, Marco
Frauchiger creates a relationship between
the people he portrays and the spaces in
which he portrays them. He also uses
spaces behind the scenes of the museum,
such as the basement, the goods lift and the
passe-partout room. It is important to him to
work with existing spatial conditions and to
incorporate the surrounding environment.

The people decide whether they would like to be photographed indoors or outdoors in the museum's surroundings.

She will make creative use of the space and light – whether daylight or direct flash – to do justice to the presence of the person being portrayed.
